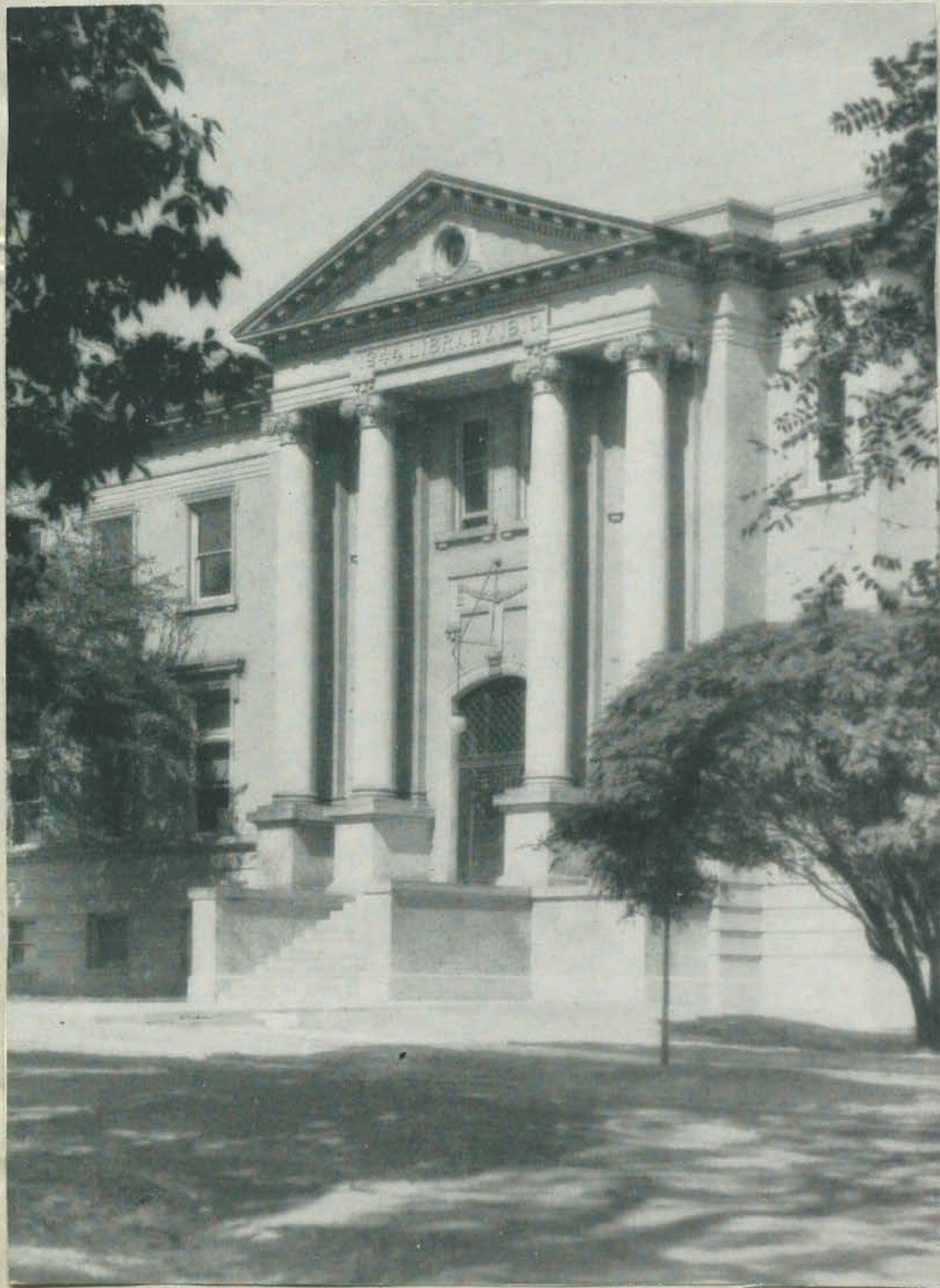
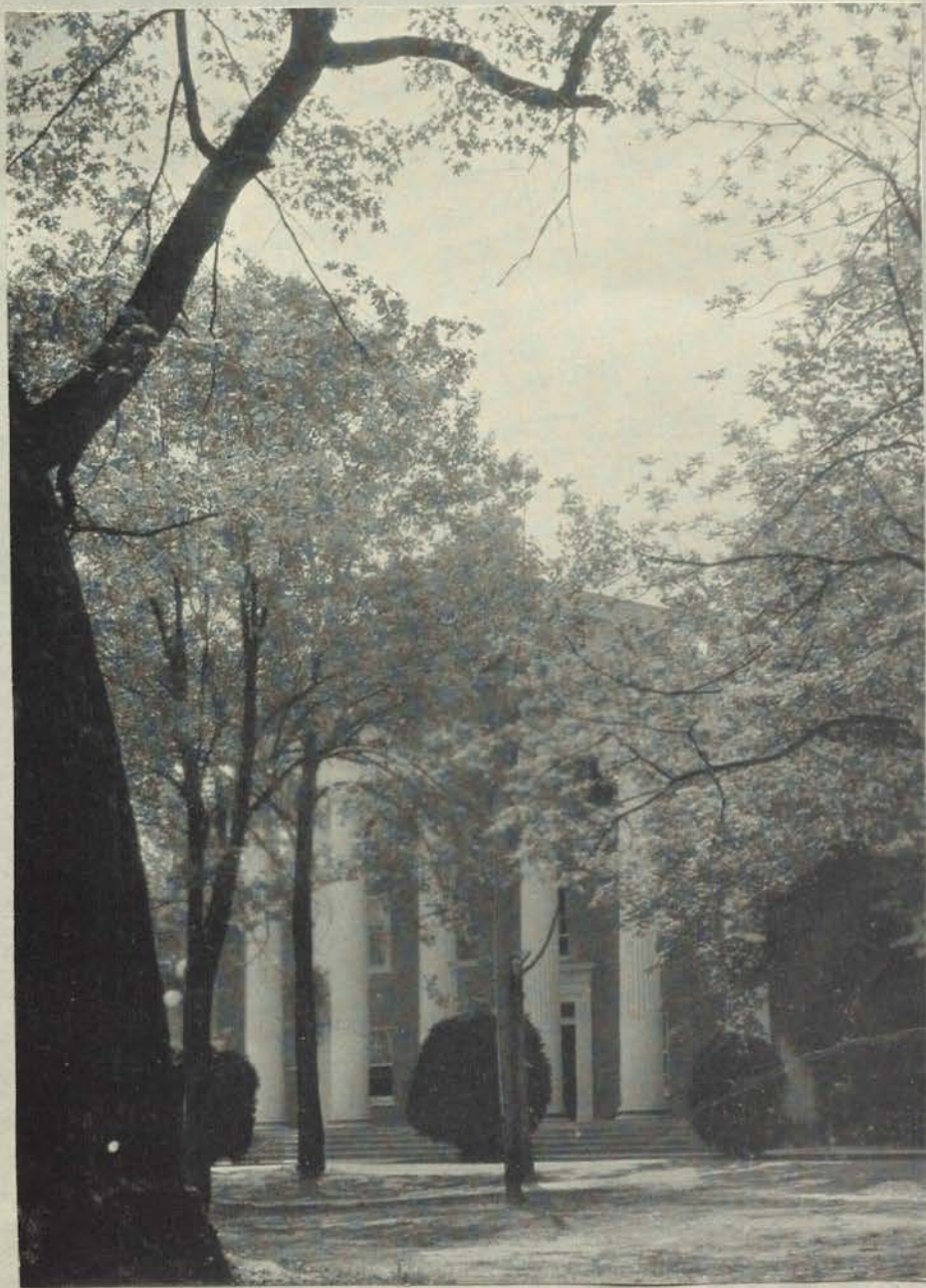

Brief History of The University of Mississippi

The University of Mississippi, better known as "Ole Miss" is situated in a grove of giant oaks; the rolling landscape gives the campus a natural beauty, unsurpassed in the entire country. When in 1848, the first session was open there were eighty students and four professors. The records indicate that most of the young men were very poorly prepared for any sort of college work, and that their ideals of college life included much more of frolic than of labor. It is said that some of the young men brought their personal servants, a span of horses, and a pack of fox hounds. This is easily understood when it is remembered that the per capita distribution of wealth in Mississippi was larger in the years preceding the Civil War than in any other State.

During the Civil War the buildings of the University were occupied sometimes by Confederate, and sometimes by Federal soldiers. Soon after the battle of Shiloh they were used for hospital purposes, and gave their shelter to some 1,500 sick and wounded Confederate soldiers. More than 700 of these sleep in unmarred graves in a cemetery near the University Campus.

When the University buildings were occupied by Federal soldiers the personal influence of Professor Barnar, who later became President of Columbia University, and other of the Professors, secured the interest of General Grant in the protection of the buildings and apparatus belonging to the institution.

Immediately after the Civil War the halls of the University were filled with a class of students never before seen in any American College. They were the sons of parents who had been wealthy, but whose wealth had been entirely swept away in the War. Perhaps half of these young men had served in the Confederate army.

After the War the University continued to grow, until at the present time there are six professional schools, in addition to the school of Liberal Arts. The same high-grade scholarship which was characteristic of the institution at its beginning has been maintained, and today the work is recognized by all institutions of learning.

HISTORY OF THE COMMERCE DEPARTMENT

The School of Commerce of the University of Mississippi was authorized by the Board of Trustees at its annual meeting held in Jackson, Mississippi, during the month of September 1917. The school proper was put into operation about the middle of the following October. However we might say that the school was really begun in 1918.

In the beginning the faculty was small. Dr. J. W. Bell who had before that time been head of the department of Economics, was made Dean of the Commerce School. Several student assistants were used and they proved to be very efficient and helpful.

The school first had its quarters in the basement of the Peabody Building. It was there that Dr. A. B. Crosier, who came to us from James Miliken University, and who has done so much to make the commercial school what it is today, began to build the foundations of the school as it now exists. Later the quarters of the school were moved to the third floor of the Lyceum building, standard equipment was purchased and the school was better fitted to render more efficient service. The courses offered were: Short Hand, Accountancy, Typewriting, Commercial Law, Business Psychology, Politics, Commercial Geography, Letter Writing, and Economics. The purpose was to give a general course in business and to make this course as practical as possible.

The growth of the School of Commerce in the University of Mississippi has been phenomenal. Starting with only a few students, the number has increased until the number which it now has enrolled surpasses that of any other school on the campus. The faculty consists of fourteen members and several assistants. As new equipment is constantly being added, each year finds the school better able to carry on its work, it might be added that our commerce school is standard in every respect and compares favorably with other commerce schools of the country.

The future of this school is indeed bright. Plans are already being laid for a larger expansion, for it is expected that the number of students which is now well over two hundred will almost double in the next few years.



HISTORY OF THE LOCAL

In the spring of 1926 on the Campus of the University of Mississippi, a small group of commercial students gathered in 2A. Lamar for the sole and only purpose of organizing a group to petition some commercial fraternity.

After this group composed of George Butler, A. E. Brinson, D. F. Muller, S. O. Seaman, C. E. Miller and Carl Coers carefully considered the different commercial fraternities by weighing their merits one against the other; came to a unanimous decision by deciding that there was but one commercial fraternity that they wanted to petition and it was Delta Sigma Pi.

All this happened at the close of the school year, so the group appointed Mr. Butler as a committee of one to write Delta Sigma Pi fraternity for information as to the process of petitioning for a charter, and make a report at the opening of school in the fall.

Mr. Butler was unable to return to school in the fall, as a result the group received no information as to the process of petitioning. They then appointed Mr. Brinson to write and find out what progress MR. Butler had made. Mr. Brinson got in touch with Mr. Butler and also with the Secretary of Delta Sigma Pi fraternity, and in a short time he had the much needed and desired information.

We at once started to work by selecting twenty men from the Commercial School, basing our selections upon friendship, character, personality, and scholastic standing. The following men, who came up to our expectations and who we thought would uphold the merits of the Delta Sigma Pi fraternity were: John R. Nennery, Earl H. Lindsey, Derwood C. Felton, William L. Raine Jr., Terry S. Swalm, D. W. Brinson, L. R. Quinn, V. L. Riley, J. V. Nichols, Norman Weathersby, S. L. Fortenberry, A. S. Henley, W. C. Yates, T. J. Lilly, John R. Barrett, S. G. Lilly, S. S. Fairman, C. B. Stevens, C. B. Walker. A meeting was called for the second Thursday night in October.

Here at this meeting the petitioning rules were read and discussed, Mr. Brinson acting as chairman. A motion was made and carried that the Chairman should appoint a committee to draw up a constitution and by-laws and report by next meeting. Mr. Miller and Mr. Muller were appointed on this committee.

After Mr. Miller and Mr. Muller had been properly instructed, a motion was made and carried, stating that Mr. Brinson

acting as chairman should appoint committees to work up the different histories that the petition called for. Mr. Chairman appointed the following committees to work up the following topics: Brief History of the University, by Mr. Coers; Brief History of the Commerce Department, by Messrs. Fortenberry, Walker, and Raine; Brief History of the Local, by Mr. Seaman; Prepare Pedigree Sheets for each Petitioner, by Messrs. Weathersby, Quinn, and Nichols. A motion was made and carried to adjourn and meet the following Thursday night at seven o'clock.

At this meeting the constitution and by-laws were read and adopted with few changes. Officers were then elected which are as follows: Head Master, A. E. Brinson; Senior Warden, J. V. Nichols; Junior Warden, C. E. Miller; Chancellor, S. L. Fortenberry; Secretary, O. S. Seaman; Historian, William Raine; Faculty Adviser, Dr. J. W. Bell; Master of Ceremonies, L. R. Quinn; Master of Festivities, W. P. Mullins; Delta Sigma Pi Correspondent, L. F. Muller; Treasurer, Norman Weathersby.

The petitioning group known as Sigma Delta appointed Messrs. Raine, Quinn, Nichols, and Coers to unite, correct, and form the petition, and send it to the Delta Sigma Pi fraternity for approval.

Fraternities at the University were abolished by legislative enactment in 1912. This act was the culmination of a long and bitter fight in the university and in the state which continued for a period of a dozen years or more. In 1926 an act was passed by the legislature repealing the anti-fraternity statute and reestablishing fraternities at the institution. Under this act the board of trustees and the faculty of the university controlled the establishment of fraternity chapters secured. They have made requirements as to scholarship which should make the University, with its enrollment of 1,100 students, a proper field for the development of what is best in the college fraternity.

The following national fraternities have already established chapters at the University of Mississippi: Sigma Chi, Phi Delta Theta, Delta Tau Delta, and Kappa Sigma Kappa Alpha, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Delta Psi, Professional : Three Medical fraternities and a pharmacy fraternity.

The future of this school is indeed bright. Plans are already being laid for a larger expansion, for it is expected that the number of students which is now well over two hundred will almost double in the next few years.

HISTORY OF THE LOCAL

In the spring of 1926 on the Campus of the University of Mississippi, a small group of commercial students gathered in 2A. Lamar for the sole and only purpose of organizing a group to petition some commercial fraternity.

After this group composed of George Butler, A. E. Brinson, L. F. Muller, S. O. Seaman, C. E. Miller and Carl Coers carefully considered the different commercial fraternities by weighing their merits one against the other; came to a unanimous decision by deciding that there was but one commercial fraternity that they wanted to petition and it was Delta Sigma Pi.

All this happened at the close of the school year, so the group appointed Mr. Butler as a committee of one to write Delta Sigma Pi fraternity for information as to the process of petitioning for a charter, and make a report at the opening of school in the fall.

Mr. Butler was unable to return to school in the fall, as a result the group received no information as to the process of petitioning. They then appointed Mr. Brinson to write and find out what progress Mr. Butler had made. Mr. Brinson got in touch with Mr. Butler and also with the Secretary of Delta Sigma Pi fraternity, and in a short time he had the much needed and desired information.

We at once started to work by selecting twenty men from the Commercial School, basing our selections upon friendship, character, personality, and scholastic standing. The following men, who came up to our expectations and who we thought would uphold the merits of the Delta Sigma Pi fraternity were: John R. Nunnery, Earl H. Lindsey, Derwood C. Felton, William L. Raine jr., Terry S. Swalm, D. W. Brinson, L. R. Quinn, V. L. Riley, J. V. Nichols, Norman Weathersby, S. L. Fortenberry, A. S. Henley, W. C. Yates, T. J. Lilly, John R. Barrett, S. G. Lilly, S. S. Fairman, C. B. Stevens, C. B. Walker. A meeting was called for the second Thursday night in October.

Here at this meeting the petitioning rules were read and discussed, Mr. Brinson acting as chairman. A motion was made and carried that the Chairman should appoint a committee to draw up a constitution and by-laws and report by next meeting. Mr. Miller and Mr. Muller were appointed of this committee.

After Mr. Miller and Mr. Muller had been properly instructed, a motion was made and carried, stating the Mr. Brinson

acting as chairman should appoint committees to work up the different histories that the petition called for. Mr. Chairman appointed the following committees to work up the following topics: Brief History of the University, by Mr. Coers; Brief History of the Commerce Department, by Messrs. Fortenberry, Walker, and Raine; Brief History of the Local, by Mr. Seaman; Prepare Pedigree Sheets for each Petitioner, by Messrs. Weathersby, Quinn, and Nichols. A motion was made and carried to adjourn and meet the following Thursday night at seven o'clock.

At this meeting the constitution and by-laws were read and adopted with few changes. Officers were then elected which are as follows: Head Master, A. E. Brinson; Senior Warden, J. V. Nichols; Junior Warden, C. E. Miller; Chancellor, S. L. Fortenberry; Secretary, O. S. Seaman; Historian, William Raine; Faculty Adviser, Dr. J. W. Bell; Master of Ceremonies, L. R. Quinn; Master of Festivities, W. P. Mullins; Delta Sigma Pi Correspondent, L. F. Muller; Treasurer, Norman Weathersby.

The petitioning group known as Sigma Delta appointed Messrs. Raine, Quinn, Nichols, and Coers to unite, correct, and form the petition, and send it to the Delta Sigma Pi fraternity for approval.

Fraternalities at the university were abolished by legislative enactment in 1912. This act was the culmination of a long and bitter fight in the university and in the state which had continued for a period of a dozen years or more. In 1926 an act was passed by the legislature repealing the anti-fraternity statute and reestablishing fraternities at the institution. Under this act the board of trustees and the faculty of the university controlled the establishment of fraternity chapters secured. They have made requirements as to scholarship which should make the university, with its enrollment of 1,100 students, a proper field for the development of what is best in the college fraternity.

The following national fraternities have already established chapters at the University of Mississippi: social -- Kappa Alpha, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Delta Psi, Sigma Chi, Phi Delta Theta, Delta Tau Delta, and Kappa Sigma; professional -- Three medical fraternities and a pharmacy fraternity.
