





INTRODUCTION  
OF  
LONGWOOD COLLEGE



Longwood College is located in Farmville, Virginia--sixty-five miles west of Richmond, forty-eight miles east of Lynchburg and sixty miles south of Charlottesville. U. S. Highways 15 and 160 intersect in town.

Farmville is a pleasant college town with a population of 6,000; it is the business and education center of the area. Hampden-Sydney College, a liberal arts college for men, is five miles south of the campus. Many points of interest are within a short distance of Farmville, including Appomatox Courthouse and Sayler's Creek Battlefield.

Longwood is a small, co-educational institution of approximately 2,500 students. Students attending Longwood choose a major from a variety of 26 separate academic areas.

The primary educational objective of Longwood College is to provide a baccalaureate curriculum distinguished by excellence. Particular attention is given to teacher preparation, and pursuant to the goal of academic excellence. Every effort is made to combine a strong liberal arts approach with this professional emphasis. The College also offers liberal arts majors, as well as business administration, pre-professional medical curricula and therapeutic recreation.

Six undergraduate degrees are offered: Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Science in Business Education, Bachelor of Science in Business Administration, and Bachelor of Music Education. In addition, Longwood College provides a graduate program leading to the Master's degree in English and Education.

Longwood College is pledged to a policy of nondiscrimination because of race or religion. The policy of nondiscrimination applies to all phases of college life including admissions.





HISTORY  
OF  
LONGWOOD COLLEGE



Longwood College, located in the rural town of Farmville, Virginia, is a pioneer in private and later in public education. It is one of the oldest colleges in the United States today.

The college was founded on March, 5 1839, as the Farmville Female Seminary Association. W. C. Flournoy, James E. Venable, Thomas Flournoy, William Wilson, George Daniel, Willis Blanton, and James B. Ely were the incorporators issuing three hundred shares of stock at \$100 each in order for the erection of a building and other items needed to start the school. Once completed, the school offered courses of Latin, English, Greek, French, and Piano. The Seminary's original enrollment consisted of thirty girls.

During the next decade, the Farmville Female Seminary flourished as did the town of Farmville. The population grew from 800 in 1839 to 2,000 by 1860.

James B. Ely, the president of the corporation, and the other stockholders in the Farmville Female Seminary Association, decided to expand the school into a college. George La Monte made the necessary arrangements for the addition of a curriculum at the college level. He became the first president of the college. On May 24, 1860, the charter was amended by the legislature and the name of the school was changed to the Farmville Female College.

On April 7, 1884, Virginia legislature passed a bill establishing the Farmville Female College as the State Female Normal School; the college became property of the state of Virginia. The Normal School was Virginia's first institution for the higher education of women. With the enrollment of 110 students, the Normal School opened on

October 30, 1884.

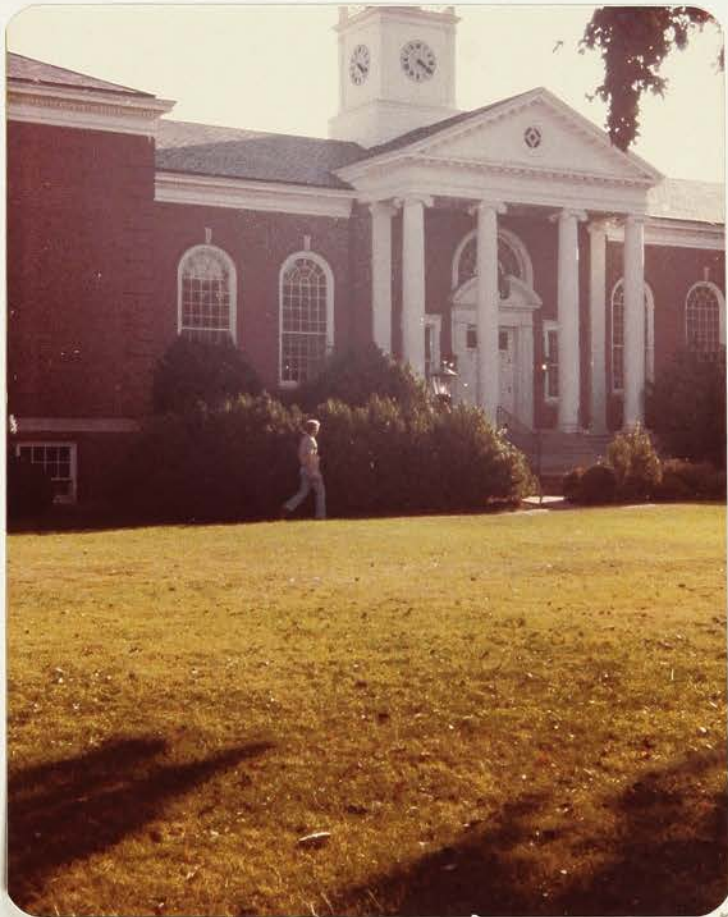
After the turn of the century, the school's name was changed several times. The first name change came in 1914 when the Female Normal School became the State Normal School for Women. Ten years later, in 1924, the name, The States Teachers College, replaced the institution's previous name. The final name change occurred in 1949 when the college received its present name, Longwood College.

In 1916 Longwood was authorized to offer four-year curricula leading to the degree of bachelor science in education. It was authorized to offer the degree of bachelor of arts in 1935, the degree of bachelor of science in 1938, curricula in business education the same year, courses leading to a degree in music education in 1949, and the degree of bachelor of science in business administration in 1976. In 1954, graduate programs were authorized.

On September 10, 1975, Longwood announced that it would become fully co-educational and as of June 1976, on campus, housing was offered to men. Becoming co-educational is only one of the many changes Longwood College has had, along with the increased enrollment as of the 1980 Fall Semester. The total undergraduate population is 2,257 students consisting of: 431 Seniors, 431 Juniors, 583 Sophomores and 812 Freshmen.

Throughout all of the many changes, Longwood has maintained a tradition of friendliness, cooperation, leadership and loyalty.







HISTORY OF THE DEPARTMENT  
OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS

The Department of Business and Economics is newer than most departments at Longwood College. The Bachelor of Science degree in business education was offered in 1938, and the Bachelor of Science degree in business administration in 1976. Yet as of December 31, 1980, the business department's enrollment consisted of 579 students, making it the largest department on campus.

HISTORY  
OF  
LAMBDA CHI

The possibility of organizing a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi at Longwood College started in the fall semester of 1980. It was the hope of 20 students and two professors, Dr. Owen Fields and Mr. Richard Measell, to get the Lambda Chi chartered as a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi in the spring semester of 1981. Officers were elected: President, Eileen Mathes; Senior Vice President, Debra Smiley; Secretary, Jenny Mims; Treasurer, Marie Hoiberg; and Chancellor, Cherie Stevens. The rest of the officers would be elected in the spring.

The officers wanted to get more students interested in Delta Sigma Pi. They began having open meetings every Thursday and put posters up stating when and where the meetings would be held. Also, a letter was sent to most of the business students telling them about the new business fraternity being started on campus. The officers spoke before organized groups and classes to recruit members.

A luncheon was held on November 18, 1980, to introduce the beginning of a business fraternity at Longwood College. Mr. Varner, from First National Bank, was the guest speaker.

When students came back from their Christmas vacation, Lambda Chi was proud to accept 23 new members. Three of these were faculty.

On January 16, 1981, Mr. Michael Tiller came to Longwood College to pledge the Lambda Chi chapter as neophytes of Delta Sigma Pi. Mr. Tiller also informed us of Delta Sigma Pi goals and policies. Afterwards the members had refreshments and spoke to Mr. Tiller on a one-to-one basis.

At our next meeting, January 22, 1981, we elected four new officers. They were Vice President Pledge Education--Ginger Thornton; Assistant Vice President Pledge Education--Beverly Lewis; Vice President of Professional Activities--Vanessa Scott; and Chairman of Social Committee--Karen Kelsey.

Our first money-making project was held on November 19, 1980. We sold baked goods in each of the dorms. We made approximately \$40.00. On the next bake sale, February 9, 1981, we made \$25.00.

Our January meetings were mostly getting Lambda Chi ready for initiation. We formed five committees. Each potential member chose at least one committee to participate in. The committees were a typing pool, a social activities group, a professional activities group, a fund raising group, and a publicity group. Cherie Stevens went over the parliamentary procedures, and we made a tentative schedule of things and objectives to be accomplished. The schedule is as follows:

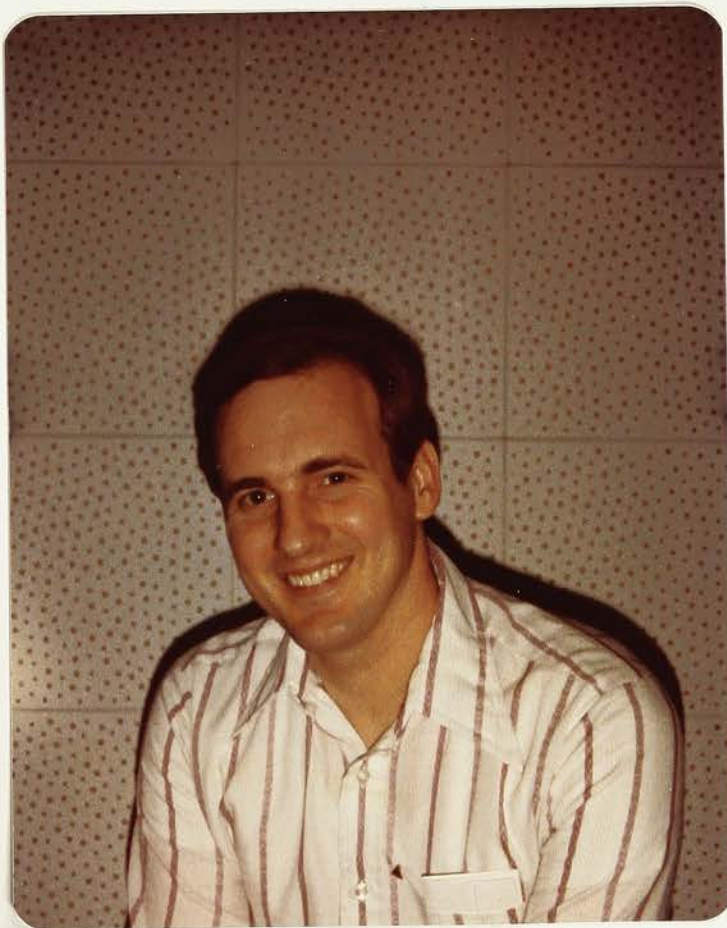
