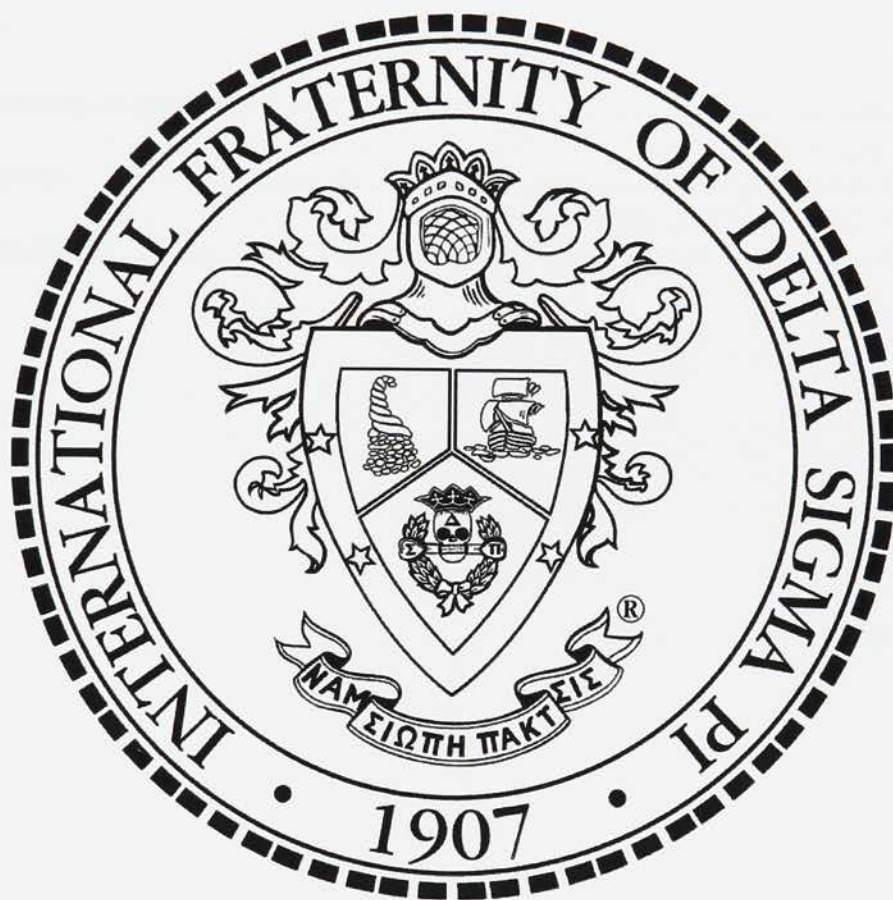

## *History of Cleary University*

Cleary University is an all business university with its main goal, “to have a ‘Cleary Mind’ in every business.” Starting out, Cleary University was called the Cleary School of Penmanship, founded by Patrick Roger “P. R.” Cleary in 1883. In 1891, the Cleary School of Penmanship officially become the Cleary Business College. Fast forward about 80 years and Cleary obtains its status as a senior college of business, accredited from the Association of Independent



Colleges and Schools. Later, in 2002, Cleary officially becomes a university and, since 1988, is accredited by the Michigan State Department of Education and the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. Today, Cleary offers the Bachelor of Business Administration, the Bachelor of Science, and the Master of Business Administration degrees.

Cleary’s roots began in Washtenaw County, but after 100 years of existence, Cleary found its home in Livingston County where its main campus was established in 1983. The first building at the Livingston County site was the Chrysler Building. Since 1983, multiple other buildings have been built or refurbished including the Lloyd and Mabel Johnson Center for Business and Community Excellence, the Lyons Building, the Wellness Center, the Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship (CIE) and its first student apartments in 2016. The MBA degree is offered in the Ann Arbor Education Center. The Detroit Education Center was



established in 2017, and will offer both bachelor's and graduate degrees. The campus is continuing to expand with our second set of student apartments along with Cleary's first athletic complex to be completed in fall 2018.

Cleary University's current and 10th president is Jayson M. Boyers, who took on this position recently in 2015. The foundation of Cleary starts with Patrick R. Cleary, as previously stated, then Owen J. Cleary took over in 1940. Donald M. Silkworth was our third president in 1960, then Walter Greig ten years later stepped up. Following Greig, Lynn Brenneman, James Perry, Gilbert E. Bursley, and Harry Howard all took on the role of president for Cleary University, each for terms of six years or less. Thomas P. Sullivan was president for over 25 years, before President Boyers took over recently. Sullivan was a big factor in the growth of Cleary and was in office during majority of the construction of our current campus facilities, before leaving the progress to President Boyers to continue on with further expansion

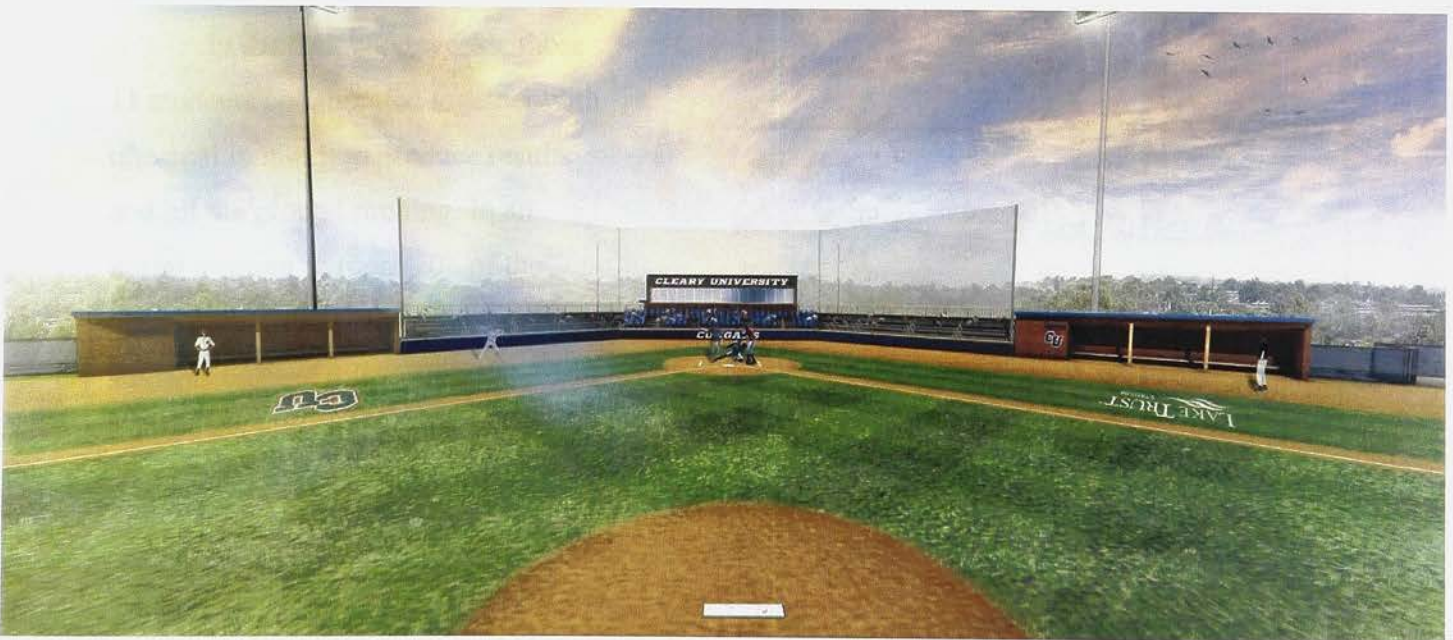
Athletics are an important part of Cleary's community and student base. Our first ever outdoor field, which will have accommodations for soccer, baseball/softball, and lacrosse events, will be completed by fall 2018. Cleary's first sports teams since the relocation of the university were the men's and women's cross country and golf teams in 2012. Shortly after, men's and women's golf were introduced in 2013, then baseball and softball in 2014, along with men's and women's lacrosse established within the 2015-14/2016-17 academic years respectively. A women's cross-country runner, Elaine Lowe became the first to win a National Championship in 2013, and followed it in 2014 with another Championship as well. The women's cross-country team won their National Championship in 2016, and before that men's golf team took the USCAA National Championship in 2015. Cleary University is also currently in the process of transitioning into an official member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, NAIA.

## Colony History

On a normal Wednesday morning, alone in her office, Brett Yenger made a phone call that was something out of the norm. This phone call would soon prove to be the catalyst that significantly reshaped the face of Cleary University as it started the process of establishing a new student organization. What Brett Yenger did on Wednesday, October 12th, 2016, was call the central office of Delta Sigma Pi requesting information about the potential formation of a Cleary University colony.

A few short days later, on October 18th, Dale Clark from the Central Office responded to Mrs. Yenger's inquiry by answering all the questions she asked as well as illustrating a picture of what Delta Sigma Pi is about. Recognizing the potential of Delta Sigma Pi, Brett organized a meeting with Provost Lance Lewis, Academic Dean Dawn Markell, and Career Development Director Amy Sauvie to discuss starting a Delta Sigma Pi colony on Cleary University's campus. Everyone at the meeting was enthusiastic about starting a colony. From that initial meeting, a few short weeks later on December 14th, 2016, Cleary University's Delta Sigma Pi had its first meeting and collected the 11 signatures for the initial letter of intent.

In the following weeks, those 11 students collaborated together with one goal in mind: to produce results and hit the ground running. In an initial meeting in room 205 of the Chrysler Building, these pioneering students worked diligently to brainstorm potential events and obtain a feel of what Delta Sigma Pi is all about. As time progressed, excitement began to build, and we encouraged our peers to join. To say the least, we


Thank you for your phone call inquiring about Delta Sigma Pi at Cleary University. I am pleased to provide you with the necessary information.

### How to Work a Career Fair - October 2017

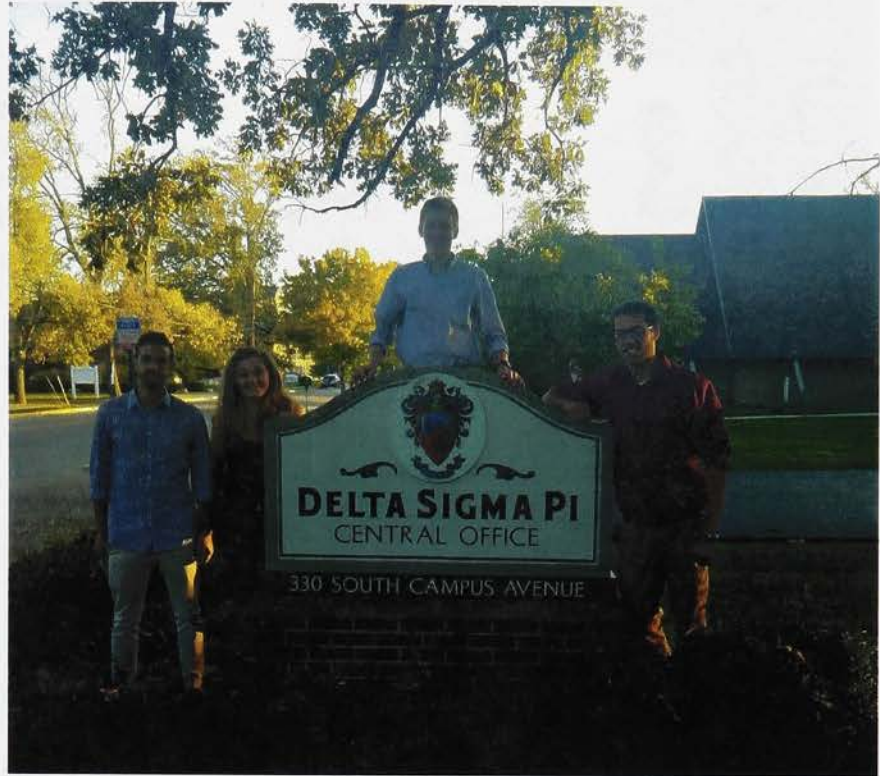

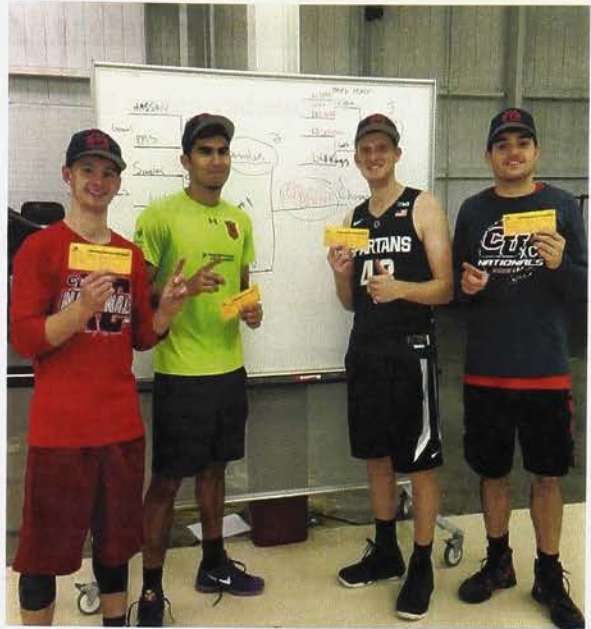
Professional Women's Club -

### Dodgeball Tournament- December 2017

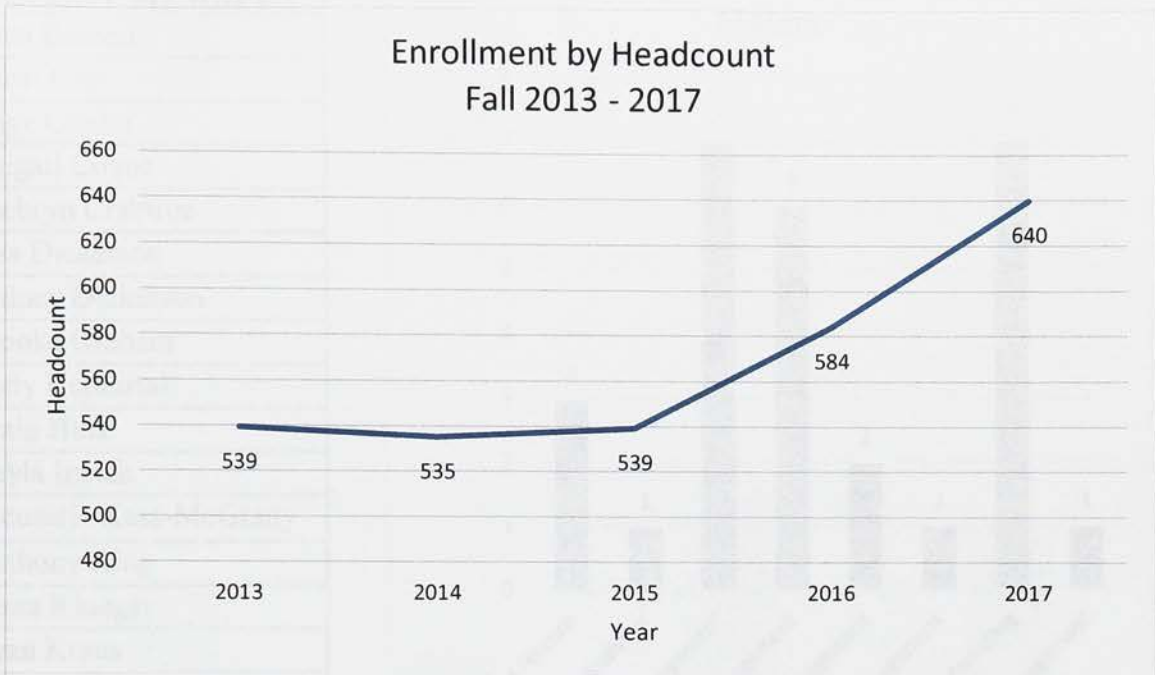
