

**THE INTERNATIONAL FRATERNITY OF DELTA SIGMA PI

Brother Corie Schilberg (Mu Pi) presented the credentials report (Addendum III). There were 51 present and voting at this meeting, out of the 60 eligible (4 chapters were not eligible). This constituted quorum of the Northeastern Provincial Council.

##### **General Comments**

The fall semester continued the mostly positive operational trend for the province. Each region conducted at least one region-wide LEAD or social event during the semester and all were well

attended. LEAD school attendance was high once again as the province celebrated along with Mu Tau and Theta Pi in the winning of multiple national awards.

## **Provincial Goal Summary**

### *Leadership development*

While still a work in progress, much has been accomplished with this goal over the fall semester. Five out of the six regions hosted LEAD type events each seeing high double-digit attendance. The events allowed chapter officers the opportunity to interact with their regional counterparts and opened the lines of communications among the local collegiate leaders. The Providence LEAD School also featured a president's forum as well as a daylong track dedicated to chapter officers, district directors, and individuals aspiring to be an officer or national volunteer leader. All sessions had good attendance and featured a lot of interaction among the participants. I was happy to see many of the track attendees come speak to me over the weekend giving me feedback on the sessions as well as general updates on their chapters.

As mentioned above, there is still work to be done in order to fully accomplish this goal. The Cleveland Provincial LEAD will also feature the volunteer/leader track and I will continue to work with the regional vice presidents on additional regional (or inter-regional) LEAD events over the spring semester. My hope is that members of the leadership teams and the chapters themselves will drive session topics along with logistics. The Steel Valley region is planning to hold a district director and officer training this semester as is the New England region.

### *Cohesive committee structure organizing provincial and regional events*

There is still much work needed on this item. Each region does have committee structures set, with all having the awards committee fully staffed. However, activity and staffing on the non-awards committees is low and in some cases non-existent. As we close the biennium, I will work with the provincial committee chairs and regional vice presidents to set provincial and regional expectations for each committee. With documented goals and event ideas, we should be able to gain momentum on this goal.

### *Increase chapter interaction*

As mentioned earlier, five out of the six regions held LEAD type events while the sixth region held a region-wide social event (a daylong sporting competition). The East Central Region also held a region-wide Founder's Day event in addition to their LEAD. The New England region is planning both a social and LEAD type event for the spring semester. Attendance at the Providence LEAD School was very high and the Cleveland Provincial Conference is nearly sold out. These LEAD and social events, coupled with the dedicated tracks, have helped increase communication among the chapters, which is leading to increased interaction.

## **Chapter and Province Operations**

### *CMP*

CMP numbers from the province are mostly positive as many of the chapters are close to the 50% submission level. Many chapters have also exceeded the 50% level. At the province's



leadership team meeting, we will discuss chapters that are below the 50% level to determine what support is needed.

### *Finances*

Chapter debt to Central Office was handled well. Long-term debts were addressed by the leadership team and the chapters resulting in expedited pay-offs.

### *Expansion*

The province had many active colonies over the past year with one chapter being installed from the process. Below is an overview on each colony:

- City University of New York – the colony has gone through two semesters of limited activity and communication but is planning to have an active semester this spring.
- Baruch College – installed October 23, 2010.
- Rochester Institute of Technology – was established in the Fall of 2009. The group’s original president has since graduated, but the individuals that have left have been busy conducting events and recruiting. The colony is hopeful for a spring or fall installation.
- Rutgers, New Brunswick – was established in early July. The group has a strong district director and is working hard on events and recruiting. Their goal is to be installed in the fall semester.
- West Liberty University – was established this fall. The group has conducted a few community service events.

### *Regional Boundaries*

With the rapid expansion in the Eastern region, a task force was commissioned to examine the regional boundaries to alleviate burden on volunteer leaders and ensure that all chapters were receiving a high level of support. After research that included discussions with the regional vice presidents and the collegiate chapters themselves, the task force has submitted a proposal to add a seventh region to the province by basically splitting the New York City chapters from the Eastern region to form the new Empire Region. This proposal creates balanced regions throughout the province. In addition, it should give the chapters in the regions the support they need from their regional vice president.

## **I. Review of goals related to my position**

- Visitation
  - Visited and attended events for 7 of the 8 collegiate chapters in Fall 2010
  - Conduct two chapter visit with the only chapter I did not see on-campus in Spring 2011
  - All DDs visited their chapters during Fall 2010 and 3 of them are attending this provincial conference
  - Continue to be visible through chapter visit or attendance @ national events (LEAD School, Provincial conference)
- Increase the leadership pool within the region (in progress)
  - To accomplish this goal, I will be soliciting nominations from chapter DDs of graduating seniors who are potential candidates for leadership positions in the future.
  - Utilizing NE Provincial RVPs and Golden Council members for referrals.
  - Soliciting alumni volunteers by contacting the alumni chapters in the region for interested alums to serve (ie DD, regional committee, etc.)
- Increase chapter participation in national events (improving)
  - 3 out of 8 collegiate chapters attended a Fall LEAD school (either New Orleans or Providence)
  - 5 out of 8 collegiate chapters attended regional LEAD conference at Mu Tau (George Mason)
  - 7 out of 8 collegiate chapters plus 1 alumni chapter have a delegate for provincial conference
  - Encourage chapters to register for 2011 Grand Chapter Congress (Louisville, KY) and 2011 LEAD School (Albany, NY)
- Increase chapter interaction (improving)
  - Several chapters in the region had interchapter events in Fall 2010. Iota Kappa and Omicron Omega had a football tailgate. DC Metro alumni chapter conducted

a social event after regional conference. Iota Rho, Xi Rho and Mu Tau did a collegiate chapter social event. Chi and Omicron Omega did a joint initiation

- Working on a framework whereas chapters in the region use each other as a resource and develop positive relationships. .
  - In the initial planning stage for a regional conference in Fall 2011 and this event will provide another opportunity for networking and information sharing among each other.
- Promote Delta Sigma Pi awards and leadership foundation scholarship (in process)
    - 5 of the 8 collegiate chapters applied for the Collegiate of the Year (COY) award this past November. Last year, 7 of 8 chapters submitted nomination for this award. 2011 Provincial COY is from the Capital Region and this is the second straight year for the region. Mu Tau COY won the regional award for 2010-2011.
    - No chapter received a scholarship from the leadership foundation but chapters have made presentations on the importance of Leadership Foundation.
    - A goal for the end of 2011 school year is to have at least 4 collegiate chapters apply for a minimum of 2 national awards and have 2 collegians apply for LeaderShape 2011. Also, have at least 1 alumni chapter apply for one national award
    - Encourage VP-AR to utilize leadership foundation scholarship program as a source for funding for their membership. I would like all collegiate chapters to have someone apply for Leadership foundation scholarship (either undergraduate or graduate).
  - CMP
    - Chapters for the most part have a good feel for CMP. A few late submission but otherwise chapters are making deadlines
    - Region earned all 3 levels of CMP recognition in 2009-2010. 2 chapters (accredited), 1 (recognition) and 1 (excellence)
    - Capital Region is on course to have at least 1 chapter earn “Chapter of Excellence”
    - Capital Region is on course to have at least 2 chapters earn “Chapter of Recognition”
    - Chapters are planning activities so that they can reach whatever CMP Tier is achievable (minimum Chapter of Recognition level).
  - Increase alumni participation and support of organized alumni chapters (in process)

- Most of the chapters have involved alumni but only a couple of these schools have successful integration with their local chapters (Shepherdstown/Epsilon Kappa; Chi/Baltimore)
- Big problem is that DC area chapters (Mu Tau, Xi Rho and Iota Rho) do not promote integration within the local chapter but their alumni do participate with the collegiate chapter
- Goal is to make sure VP-AR promote participation in the local alumni chapter(s) and have the regional alumni committee obtain information on graduating seniors so outreach efforts can be done.
